Hello, Downtown Friends!

As you know by now, our annual Wine Walk is this Friday, May 17, from 6 to 9 p.m.! We have sold 598 tickets for this event! Because designated drivers don't need tickets, that means that there will be more than 600 people downtown on Friday night! With that in mind, here's what you need to know:

- ⇒ West Main Street between Mulberry and South Streets, and North Lincoln Street between East Locust and Columbus Streets, will close at 5 p.m. and will re-open at 9:30 p.m.
- ⇒ "No Parking" signs will go up on West Main Street between Mulberry and South Streets at 8 a.m. on Friday in preparation for the street closure.
- ⇒ There are 25 different downtown businesses and organizations participating in the event. They are located on Locust Street (between Mulberry and Lincoln Streets), on West Main Street (between Spring and South Streets), on Sugartree Street (between South Mulberry and South Lincoln Streets), on South Mulberry Street (between West Main and West Sugartree Streets), on South Street (between Locust and Main Streets), and on North Lincoln Street (between East Locust and Columbus Streets). The trolley will run a route surrounding those locations. (See the [event map](#) for details.)

Finally, this event is our chance to make a good impression on visitors to our community. Ticket holders come from communities around southwest Ohio, but also from as far away as Louisville, KY, and Richmond, IN! The City is pitching in with new banners on the light poles (weather permitting installation), flowers in the hanging baskets (weather permitting installation), repainted fire hydrants, and fresh mulch on the trees, but we need you to do your part! Can you take a few minutes to make sure that your storefront area is clean – particularly the flowerpots on the sidewalk? An empty flowerpot at best becomes a trash can, at worst it becomes an ash tray. Let's make our downtown SHINE!
